The Master's program at Georgetown's Center for Eurasian, Russian, and East European Studies (CERES) brings together scholars, practitioners, and students working on contemporary and historical issues affecting Eurasia and beyond. Through multidisciplinary coursework on the politics, history, language, and culture of the post-Soviet space, CERES educates experts and professionals prepared to engage with global challenges and supports innovative research on Europe and Eurasia.

Program Information

Course of study: 4-semester, 36-credit program that combines interdisciplinary core courses, advanced language training, and electives focused on the student's curricular interest. CERES also offers Undergraduate and Graduate Certificates to Georgetown students outside the CERES program.

Program size: 15-20 graduates per year.

Merit-based aid: more than 70% of students receive scholarship and fellowship funding.

Languages: Georgetown offers instruction in Russian, Persian, Polish, Turkish, and Ukrainian.

Overseas opportunities: CERES students have won Fulbright and Boren grants to conduct research overseas. Financial support for unpaid summer internships or summer language study may be available.

Careers: Washington, DC's location offers students internship opportunities in the private sector, U.S. government agencies, think tanks, and non-governmental organizations. CERES has an excellent track record placing graduates in these sectors as well as in finance, consulting, and international development. Other graduates pursue further education in law, business, and PhD programs.

Application Deadlines:

- **January 15** (with consideration for scholarship and fellowship funding)
- **April 1** (with no consideration of funding)

Admissions Requirements:

- Resume/CV
- Statement of Purpose
- GRE (optional)
- Three years of study in a regional language
